I have also added this brief introduction, a contents page at the start of each section, and the colour photographs.



ST ANNE'S CHURCH, BASLOW in the diocese of Derby

The National Association of Decorative and Fine Arts Societies (NADFAS) record of Church Furnishings, 1990, was compiled during the incumbency of the Rev. Martin Leigh by the Cavendish Group.

HISTORY

In 1192 John, Earl of Mortain (later King John) gave the patronage of Bakewell Church with its seven chapels of ease - Baslow, Beeley, Chelmorton, Harthill, Longstone, Monyash and Taddington to the Dean and Chapter of Lichfield. (1)

In 1280 During Archbishop Peckham's visitation it was agreed that the Dean and Chapter of Lichfield should contribute $2\frac{1}{2}$ marks (£1.66) towards the salary of the minister at Baslow, with an equal contribution from parishioners. The agreement was of short duration for in 1315 only 15s 0d (£0.75) was paid and the Dean and Chapter declined to help defray the cost of repairing the fabric of the church.

In Henry VIII's assessment of the values of church properties (Valor Ecclesiasticus), 1536, the chapelry had a clear value of £27 6s 8đ (£27.33).


Oliver Cromwell's Parliamentary Commissioners described Baslow in 1650 as a parochial chapel thought fit to be made a parish with Bubnell, Corbar and Calver.

The oldest parts of the church, north aisle and tower, date from the late 13th C, the present north aisle being the original nave which accounts for the unusual position of the tower. The main body of the church is late Decorated or Perpendicular in style, but much altered in 1853 when an architect who was the nephew of Sir Joseph Paxton rebuilt the chancel and restored much of the fabric. Many of the windows date from this period. In 1911 a vestry was added at the east end of the south aisle.

From 1811 its patron has been the Duke of Devonshire.

In the centre the Last Supper carved in high relief is set under a cusped ogee arch on which stands a pelican in her piety. On plinths decorated with acanthus leaves either side of the central arch stand angels beneath cusped ogee arches, with vines and ears of wheat under their outstretched wings. The three panels each side have Gothic arches supported on circular columns with Attic bases and central moulded compressed knots. Blank arcades carry texts in gold Lombardic (maj) with initial letters to key words picked out in red and black. Decorative strands of diamonds between parallel lines in red and gold adorn the panels where the text finishes.

From left to right the texts are:

- c) Commandments I & II
- d) Commandments III & IIII(sic)
- e) Commandments V VIII
- f) Commandments IX & X

Along the top is a cornice with a single band of undulating foliage and a simple carved moulding. A carved frieze with a patence cross at each end carries a Lombardic (maj) inscription, with colons separating the words. A shelf below the three central arches is supported on four brackets. The columns stand on a lower stage with six blind trefoil headed arches, two per bay, with applied moulding on each side, and four plain panels. The whole screen stands on a deep solid plinth with a moulded edge.
