

## 400. ALTAR FRONTAL & PULPIT FALL Dr

VESTRY

- 1. a) A festal frontal depicting a cross. On a ground of coarse cream Glamis linen the design is carried out in applied gold dupion, gold P.V.C., cream felt, large and small bugle beads, pearl sequins, round white and gold beads, crystals of fluorspar and galena, gold cords and a mixture of rug and weaving yarns and perle machine-embroidery threads. The embroidery is a mixture of hand and machine stitchery. The frontal is interlined with hessian and lined with cream cotton sateen. This is attached to a linen cloth to go over the altar.

  At the back edge is a row of brass rings to locate on hooks at the back of the altar.
  - b) The fall hangs from a hardboard square and depicts a stylised cross with similar decoration to the frontal. It is backed by hessian.

## 401. ALTAR FRONTAL Dr

VESTRY

1. A frontal to be used any time in the church year as it includes the full range of liturgical colours - greens, reds, blues, violets and golds. Symbolic motifs; a central Passion cross flanked by Anchor and Celtic crosses with subsidiary Latin crosses, the Chi-Rho, I.H.S., Alpha and Omega, the Star of David, and the Trinity and Epiphany stars, dove and fish, and the flames of the Holy Spirit are all in different shades of gold dupion.

The background is deep blue dupion with side panels of crimson, rich green and two shades of peacock blue. The central panel is in two shades of green and lavender and scarlet. An attached linen altar cover extends to line the frontal and on this lining is embroidered an inscription.






## 402. PULPIT FALL Dr


**VESTRY** 

1. A pulpit fall in deep violet, the liturgical colour for Advent. The arms of a central Anchor cross form the beam of a balance over which an alpha and omega are set. The cross is in plain and textured gold PVC, alpha and omega in orange and yellow dupion, and the scale pans in copper dupion. The suspension chains are in copper lurex yarn, and behind the whole design are machined concentric circles in deep clover-pink, red, deep violet, and navy-blue couched weaving threads. Small gold beads enhance the cross. The fall hangs from a hardboard square covered in cream cotton sateen, which also backs the fall.

#### 403. PULPIT FALL Dr

### VESTRY

A pulpit fall in green, the liturgical colour for Epiphany. An angled 1. Epiphany star with points removed is surmounted by the Glastonbury Thorn with three flowers. The star is applied in pale yellow silk with the addition of textured furnishing fabric in shades of yellow and orange and a plain gold fabric, all attached by machined satin stitch. The rays from the star are in gold lurex, the flowers in ivory dupion with olive-green free machine embroidery round the petals, and yellow in the centre. The veins from the centre are green, with small gold beads. The stem and leaves are in dark green felt. The background is a corded furnishing fabric with an iridescent effect in dark orange and gold.

The fall hangs from a hardboard square covered with cream poplin, which also

lines the fall.

#### 404. PULPIT FALL Dr

VESTRY

A pulpit fall in cream, the liturgical colour for Lent. A dramatic inter-1. pretation of the Crucifixion with a crown of thorns and three nails. The background is in cream linen covered by blue, yellow and pink nets to give atmosphere for a silver PVC and dark grey and ivory dupion chalice, with three nails in dark grey dupion. Above, an overlay of a spiky crown of thorns in deep blue, with free-machine embroidery in black thread and couched black weaving

The fall hangs from a hardboard square covered with cream cotton, which also

backs the fall.







## VESTRY

Pulpit fall in red, the liturgical colour for Whitsuntide. The background 1. is flame-red dupion, with five symbolic flames outlined by a double and single layer of net, overlaid by a further layer of dark red net, so that the flames shine out. The flames issue from the top of a golden crown which is decorated cont..../1

## 406. PULPIT FALL Dr

**VESTRY** 

- 1. A pulpit fall in green, the liturgical colour for Trinity. On a background of textured tweed-like furnishing fabric in shades of green are symbols of the Trinity, three identical equilateral triangles staggered vertically in dark green, emerald and light green nets, creating further shades at the overlaps. Superimposed are three interlocking circles in yellow-green, dark olive and emerald dupion attached by machined satin stitch and decorated with small turquoise beads. The fall hangs from a square of hardboard covered in cotton sateen, which also lines the fall.


- 1. A pulpit fall in purple, the liturgical colour for Lent. A Latin cross in silver PVC is set against an abstract background of mainly vertical stripes which darken and widen towards the sides. The base is a plain weave, a violet and navy warp with two lines of silver lurex thread either side of the cross's vertical member, and a predominantly lavender weft with some bands of navy blue and silver.
  - The fall, which hangs from a hardboard square covered with black poplin, is lined and interlined with black hessian.


**VESTRY** 

- 1. Three matching pieces for Whitsuntide in red. All have a Crusader's cross in smooth and textured PVC applied on to a Monk's Belt weave in vertical blocks darkening from orange at the top to wine at the base.
  - a) The fall is decorated with strands of gold lurex yarn, and is lined and interlined with cream linen, and hangs from a hardboard square.

b) The burse is square, hinged and lined.




Set of five pulpit falls for the Church's year, using liturgical polours.

## 409. PULPIT FALL, BURSE AND VEIL Dr

VESTRY

- 1. A matching set in forest-green dupion. A central Latin cross with slightly tapering arms is backed by concentric circles, perfect on the burse and veil, but broken on the fall (see 7 below). The cross is gold and is decorated with gold lurex threads, and the circles are alternately dark peacock blue and emerald green. Small gold beads are added at the centre. The fall hangs from a hardboard square. All three pieces are lined in green cotton sateen, and the burse is edged with fine gold lurex cord.







- 1. Embroidered panel of St Anne teaching the Virgin to read. On a woven ground of olive-green warp and pale gold weft, the design is appliqueed in hand and machine embroidery. St Anne wears a robe of greenish-grey brocade, a shawl and silk headdress in different shades of gold, and a golden halo with braid and long bugle beads. Mary is in ivory dupion and a white and gold overdress. She reads from a scroll made of dark-brown suede with textured gold supports. She has a golden halo with added cords. The hands and heads of the figures are painted. Either side of St Anne's halo are two roundels containing painted views, the church on the left and the old bridge at Baslow on the right. The panel is framed and carries an inscription in Roman (maj/min) on a brass plate in the bottom left hand corner.







SAINT ANNE TEACHING THE VIRGIN MARY TO READ by Eleanor Burn





CREST: Upon the royal helmet the Imperial crown proper, thereon statant guardant or, a lion imperially crowned also proper.

SUPPORTERS: Dexter, a lion rampant guardant or, crowned as the crest.
Sinister, a unicorn argent, armed, and crined or, gorged
with a coronet of crosses pates and fleurs-de-lys
gold, and attached thereto a chain of the last
passing between the forelegs and reflexed over the
back.

MOTTO: Dieu et mon Droit.

In the 1852 alterations this gallery was removed and the organ transferred to the North wall of the North aisle, and then in 1909 to the new vestry where it remained until replaced by the present organ in 1959.

  Chalmers and Hyde of Dronfield overhauled the organ in 1980 and this firm continues to maintain and tune the instrument.
